"VISITORS ARE ALWAYS WELCOME"

IS BIBLE STUDY A WASTE OF TIME?

Many in our present culture would answer the above question in the affirmative. Serious Bible study is undertaken by some for the sole purpose of disproving its declarations. Their defiant intent is to silence its message permanently. But "the Book of books" remains! Those who truly know it and love it will appreciate the following points as to why we should spend precious time searching its sacred pages.

First, perusal of its sublime principles will prepare us for temptation. "It is written" is a deterrent to the devil's subtle advances (Matt. 4:1-11). God's word is a "blockade" to sin (Psalm 119:11). It identifies lusts and cautions us to avoid them (James 1:12-15; cf. 1 John 2:15-17).

Second, regular, persistent, and prayerful Bible study will prepare us to teach others. Paul's message is "teach..., teach..., teach": "And the things which you have heard of me among many witnesses, commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also" (2 Tim. 2:2). Peter enjoins us to "be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear" (1 Peter 3:15).

Third, study of "The Good Book" is essential to growth, whether personal or collective. Just as newborns need their mother's milk or a similar substitute to grow, so "new converts" need a steady diet of "the sincere (pure) milk of the word" (1 Peter 2:2). It should be noted that there is no "suitable substitute" for God's word. It alone is "the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth". Jesus clearly declares: "Your word is truth", as He prays to the Father (John 17:17). Churches which abandon truth for traditions of men will not grow spiritually, even though their numbers may swell due to the speaking of "smooth things" (See Isa. 30:10; Jer. 12:6).

Fourth, Bible study is required for us to please God. Paul encouraged young Timothy to "study to show yourself approved unto God" (2 Tim. 2:15). We should strive to be an "Enoch". Though he lived in the pre-flood world, he "walked with God" and "pleased God" (Gen. 5:24; Heb. 11:5). Man's noblest aspiration is to walk with God and his highest accomplishment is to please Him. Amen!
