* Heaven is a Beautiful Place (Rev. 21:9-27). When John tries to describe the most beautiful place which consists of nothing of the earth, he had to describe it in terms that we can relate to, thus he used precious gems, streets of gold, etc. There is no more preciousness and beauty than what will exist in heaven.

* Heaven is a Bountiful Place (Rev. 22:1-2). John also describes heaven as a place where there are no wants – everything is provided in the highest quantity and quality. In it a perfect life and health.

* Heaven is a Blissful Place (Rev. 22:3-6). John also wanted to remind us that heaven is a place of personal and permanent association with God – a place of peace and joy and love – forever.

MAKING GOD “SECOND BEST”

In this very “busy” world we live in, we are prone to neglect the most important part of life, and that is our spiritual life. The material world offers us much in the way of fulfilling our fleshly appetites but little in the way of fulfilling our spiritual “needs”. We must always remember that this life is temporary (James 4:14) and that the “things” we are so busy accumulating in this life are temporary as well (1 John 2:15-17). We never know when the Lord will require our soul (Luke 12:20) thus our most important “thing” in life is to “do the will of God” (Ecclesiastes 12:13; Matthew 7:21; James 1:22; 1 John 2:17). God will supply all our “needs” (Philippians 4:18-19).
