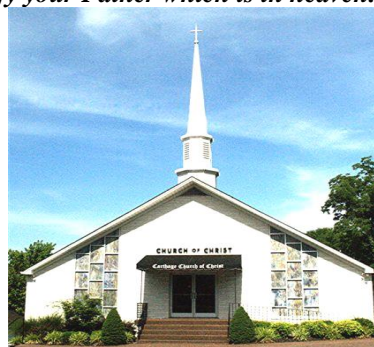

How to take these thoughts from these pages and attach to a soul, I know not. I only know that you who lead God’s people will be totally successful if you can influence the congregation to commit these pages to memory.

1.) The church must radiate a righteous and wholesome influence in the community. “I” must live the example of a good Christ-like life. “I” must live soberly, righteously, and godly. (Matthew 5:13-16).

2.) The church, to be successful, must have faithful and courageous leaders. “I” along with other members can make or break the leadership.
