IF DIRT COULD TALK

The Lord's "Parable of the Sower" (Matthew 13:1ff, Mark 4:1ff, Luke 8:1ff) has also been called the "Parable of the Soils." These soils represent four types of human hearts.

THE WAYSIDE HEART

In its honest moments, this heart reveals an astonishing indifference to God and his will. Satan snatches the seed of the Gospel away through pride, doubt, and indifference. The wayside heart talks about everything but God and His Word. Spiritually speaking, there is no room for God in this heart, and therefore, there will be no place in heaven for it.

THE SHALLOW GROUND HEART

In this heart the Word springs up quickly, but the least bit of persecution or difficulty wilts it. It believes for a while, and then falls away (Luke 8:13). There is no depth or spirituality in this heart. This heart is fickle and shallow, capricious, and unstable. The Word in this heart lacks substance and roots, and so it withers and fades away.

THE BURDENED GROUND HEART

This heart will talk to you about all of its appointments, obligations, responsibilities, and duties. This heart is preeminently concerned with cares and riches and the pleasures of this life. Therefore, it brings no fruit to perfection (Luke 8:14). This heart says, "Please get somebody else. I am too busy. I do not have time."

THE GOOD AND HONEST GROUND HEART

This heart speaks the most beautiful lesson in the world: "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all of these things shall be added unto you"(Matthew 6:33). What a message! What a declaration! May our hearts ever speak this dedicated theme and bring fruits and patience (Luke 8:15).

Our hearts do talk. Our message of life is manifest before God and man. May our hearts be the soil out of which grows great spiritual fruit to God's glory. "Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer"(Psalms 19:14).

FROM THE PREACHER'S HEART:

ANXIETY

Had any lately?! A recent study reports that four of every ten Americans now suffer from "Next Day Anxiety". It is surprising the number is not higher! COVID, crime, murders, shootings, rapes, rioting, and general unrest dominate the 24/7 news cycle. The "Next Day Anxiety" tag reminds us of Jesus' words: "Sufficient for the day is its own trouble" (Matt. 6:34).

God, His will, and His way are largely forgotten and conveniently ignored by the masses. Instead of living up to our "monetary motto" – "In God We Trust" - many now trust in money itself or the things it can buy. But, as has been proven time after time, money cannot buy peace of mind.

Whether it is "today" or "tomorrow", we must never leave the Lord out of the equation. "Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit'; whereas **you do not know what will happen tomorrow**. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away. Instead you ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that'. But now you boast in your arrogance. All such boasting is evil" (James 4:13-16 – NKJ, emphasis added).

Worry and anxiety sap our spiritual vitality. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus contrasts laying up "treasures in heaven" and gathering "treasures on earth" (Matt. 6:19-20). He teaches us to focus on the "good" and the "light" (vs. 22-23). He reveals the futility of divided allegiance stating two impossibilities: (1) "No one can serve two masters" and, (2) "You cannot serve God and mammon" (v. 24). Based upon these principles He teaches us not to worry about life, stature, food, drink, and clothing (vs. 25-34). These things God provides for His creation (vs. 28-30). Jesus offers comforting assurance: "Your heavenly Father knows that you need these things" (v. 32). The point is, God is a faithful Provider!

"Therefore do not worry" or "So why do you worry" occurs several times within the context (See vs. 25, 28, 31, 34). The last occurrence is, "Therefore **do not worry about tomorrow**" (v. 34). "Tomorrow" is the "Next Day" after "Today", so Jesus provides the antidote for "Next Day Anxiety"!

"But what do I do in the meantime?", someone asks. Jesus answers the question: "**But seek you first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you**" (v. 33).
