JESUS’ DOCTRINE

Two Greek terms (*didaskalia* and *didache*) are translated “doctrine”. In his Analytical Concordance, Robert Young has both words referring to “teaching”: the first to “the substance” and the second to “the act” (267). Jesus excelled in both. He has no equal.

Jesus is often described as “The Master Teacher” and such He was and is. Truly, never has anyone spoke and taught as He (John 7:46). To the astonishment of those who originally heard His “Sermon on the Mount”, Jesus taught in a manner not previously observed. His method stood in sharp contrast to that of other teachers - “the scribes” - of His day (Matt. 7:28-29). It is “one of a kind” in manner and message and delivery and doctrine.

The brief and beautiful letter of John “to the elect lady and her children” (2 John 1), is worthy of our consideration. It provides an array of helpful information about “the doctrine of Christ”. John declares, “Whoever transgresses and does not abide in **the doctrine of Christ** does not have God. He who abides in **the doctrine of Christ** has both the Father and the Son” (v. 9).

The doctrine of Christ is both exclusive and inclusive. It is inclusive in that all are invited by Christ (Matt. 11:28-30). “Whosoever will” or “whoever desires” (NKJ), may come (Rev. 22:17). But it is also exclusive in that all who reject it have no other option by which to be saved: “Whoever...does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God.” Language could not be clearer. Just as clear is the positive declaration: “He who abides in **the doctrine of Christ** has both the Father and the Son.” What assurance this gives to the faithful!

The doctrine of Christ is “truth”. “Truth” is mentioned five times in the first four verses of 2 John. John’s record of Jesus’ life describes Him as “the way, the **truth**, and the life” (14:6). Of course, Jesus came “full of grace and **truth**” (John 1:14). The same text describes Him as the exclusive way to the Father: “**No man comes unto the Father except by Me**”. Because it is truth, the doctrine of Christ does not need to be “updated” as are the doctrines, disciplines, and dogmas of men.

John’s warnings must not go unnoticed. He pleads with his readers to continue to “walk according to His commandments, that as you have heard from the beginning, you should walk in it” (v. 6). Verse 7 begins with the word “For” which denotes a reason why it is important to continue to walk in Jesus’ doctrine. That reason is the presence and practice of false teachers whose desire it was to deceive and lead them to embrace and walk in some other doctrine. Don’t abandon the doctrine of Christ and don’t receive anyone who brings any other doctrine (vs. 10, 11) **Edward L. Anderson**
