On his second missionary journey, Paul came to the city of Philippi. There, while worshipping by the river, he met and baptized Lydia. But not all in Philippi listened to Paul and he was falsely accused of “troubling the city” (Acts 16:20). Beaten and thrown into prison, Paul and Silas did not let persecution stop their preaching. Instead, they sang hymns to God. An earthquake gave Paul the opportunity to tell the jailor about the hope of eternal life through Jesus. The jailor gathered his family and they heard the precious message of Jesus Christ. He and all in his household were immediately baptized--the same hour of the night!

Paul could have griped and moped about his problems. Instead, he was devoted to serving God. He had come to a city where he knew no one. On the day of worship, he went where others were worshipping God. An obstacle became an opportunity to tell others about Jesus. Falsely imprisoned, he preached Christ to the keeper of the jail.

How important is Christ to us today? Are we going where we can worship with others? Can we overcome the fear of persecution, or rejection by telling others the good news of Jesus? When our soul’s salvation becomes more important than worldly favor, then we like Paul, will be “ready in season and out of season” to spread the gospel to our world.



### WHAT GIFTS DO YOU BRING?

Just about everyone is thinking about “gifts” at this time of the year. But let us ever remember: “Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above and comes down from the Father...” (James 1:17). Remember too, His gifts are not seasonal, but daily (Matt. 5:45; 6:11). We have so much for which to be thankful every day.

What “gifts” can I give to God? Ancient Israel made many offerings and gifts: “Of all your **gifts** you shall offer up every heave offering due to the Lord...” (Num. 18:29) They burned the dead bodies of lambs and rams as sacrificial gifts to God (Psa. 66:15). We, in the new dispensation, are to offer a more “personal” gift: “I beseech you therefore brethren, by the mercies of God, that you **present your bodies a living sacrifice**, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service” (Rom. 12:1). Yes, we are to give material, monetary gifts as we have been prospered (2 Cor. 9:6-7), but God first wants the giver (2 Cor. 8:5)! Why not give God the gifts He really desires, your love, your heart, your soul, and your mind (Matt. 22:37-38; cf. Matt. 16:24)?

What “gifts” can I give to members of my family? Parents, above all, give your children a proper upbringing. This involves much more than merely providing the material things they need. Parents are charged - fathers in particular: “Do not provoke your children to wrath, but **bring them up** in the training and admonition of the Lord” (Eph. 6:4; cf. Prov. 22:6). Young mothers are urged to give the “gift” of love to their children (Titus 2:4). They are further admonished to be “homemakers” (Titus 2:5), or “keepers at home” (KJV). Children should give the “gifts” of honor, respect, and obedience to their parents (Eph. 6:1-2; cf. Ex. 20:12). But what can I give my spouse? One commercial suggests husbands should give a cute puppy to the wife and the wife give a brand spanking new GMC pickup to her husband! Most men would say that’s a great trade off. When all is said and done, the greatest “gift” a husband and wife can give each other is love (Eph. 5:25- 33).

What “gifts” can I give to my fellowmen, my friends, even strangers? Try giving a smile, a friendly greeting, and some good will to those you meet along life’s way. Too many behave as if they were weaned on vinegar, lemons, and dill pickles! As the song goes, “Try a little kindness”. Paul, in Colossians 3:12-15, provides an extensive list of “gifts” Christians have to give: tender mercies; kindness; humility; meekness; longsuffering; forbearance; forgiveness; love; peace; and gratitude. These will let our light shine which may cause others to come to Christ and to glorify the Father in heaven (Matt. 5:16). Let us all freely give!
