

SPIRITUAL GIANTS AMONG US!

All of us have known men and women that we could call spiritual giants. Usually these individuals would have faithfully served God for many years, done great acts of service of a public nature and would be fairly well known among the brotherhood. There are many spiritual giants mentioned in the Bible, and one would usually think about the apostles. However, there are other individuals mentioned in the Bible whom God would undoubtedly list as spiritual giants, yet are relatively unknown individuals. One such person would be Epaphroditus.

Epaphroditus is mentioned by name only twice in the Bible, both times in Philippians 2:25; 4:18. Most people, including many Christians, would have no idea who he was. As far as we know, he preached no sermons or established no churches, yet what service he performed for God and Paul! Paul used words such as fellow-worker, fellow-soldier, messenger and minister to describe him (Philippians 2:25). He especially ministered to Paul, even while Paul was in prison. To minister to someone in prison for being a Christian would be putting your life on the line and proclaiming to the world that you were also a Christian. Indeed, he did risk his life for Christ, because as he was serving Paul, he contracted a serious disease and almost died (Philippians 2:27). However, it seems that his main concern was not for himself; rather, he was troubled because the Philippians had heard he was sick. Epaphroditus was a man ready to do anything he could for Christ without concern for himself.

Are you like Epaphroditus? The church today needs more people like Epaphroditus, men or women willing to serve wherever they are needed. They may not perform some noble public service, but without their help, men like Paul would be greatly hindered in their work. A missionary cannot be successful without a number of faithful Christians supporting him. It might be said, “Behind every successful preacher is a good group of Christians.” Epaphroditus was one of that group, and may you be one as well, because those who are “behind the scenes” are worthy of great honor (Philippians 2:29).
